

Wildlife Photography: Shooting and Editing in RAW formats with DSLR Cameras with Stephen W. Ramsden, Director Sunlit Earth! Tuesday, May 12, 7:30 to 8:15 PM

Join Stephen W. Ramsden, Director of Sunlit Earth!, for a free webinar introducing you to shooting and editing in RAW formats with DSLR cameras. In this webinar, Stephen will discuss the reasons you should be shooting images in RAW format, and shows you how it can greatly increase the quality of your wildlife

photography in no time with very little effort.

Stephen will take field images in RAW format and show viewers how to process them using the RAW importer in Lightroom/Photoshop CC. This is very similar to any other RAW importer software and the methods are usable in any RAW editing software.
