

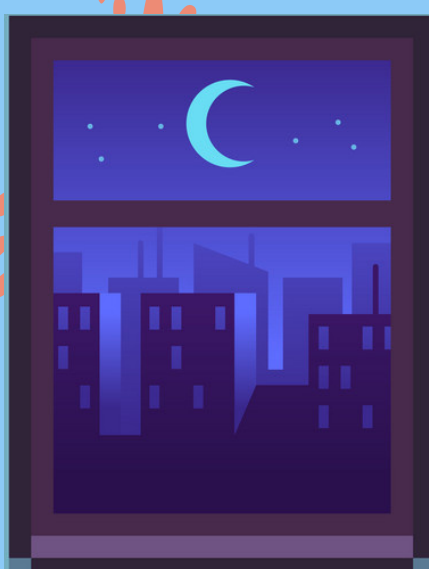
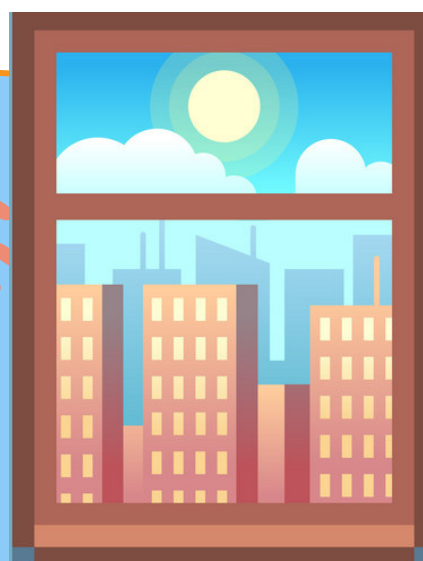


WINDOW COLLISIONS

Up to One billion birds collide with windows in North America annually

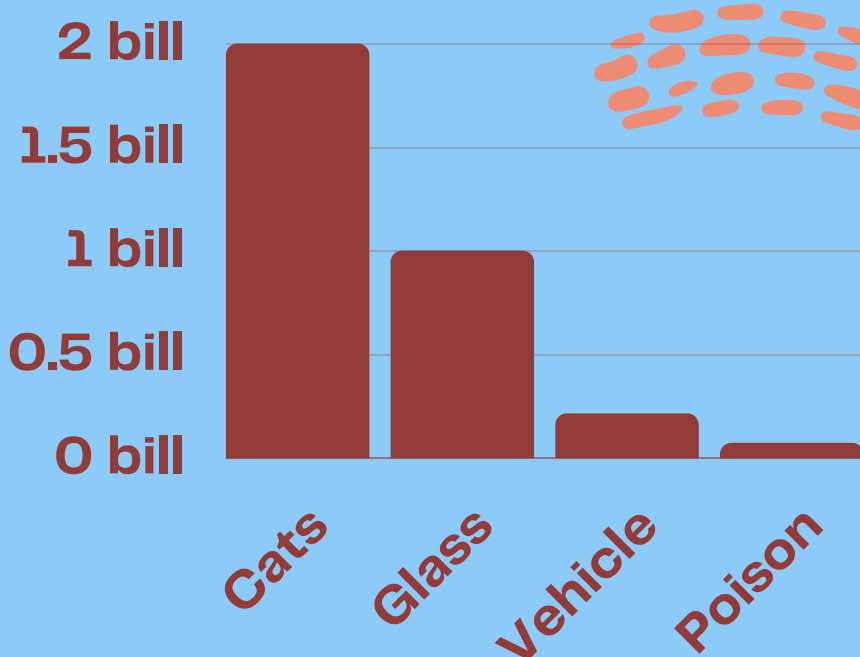
Why Do Collisions Occur?

During daytime, windows may reflect the sky, trees, and surrounding landscapes, confusing birds. Birds don't perceive transparent glass as a barrier and fly into it



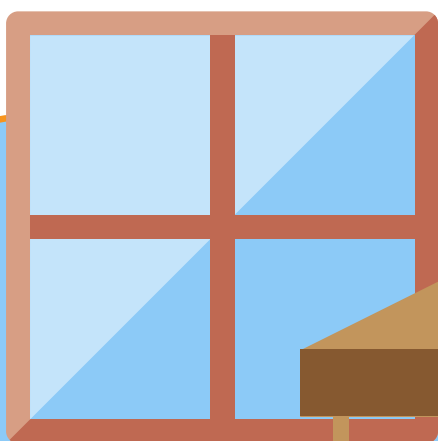
At night, lights from windows or cities may attract birds, confusing them and diverting them from their paths

Aside from habitat loss, window collisions are the 2nd leading human-caused threat to birds, right behind domestic cats



Up to 76% of window collisions are fatal
