WHAT: Atlanta Audubon Society will celebrate the official unveiling of the Exhibitat in Piedmont Park on **Tuesday, September 25**, with three events beginning at 10:00 AM and running until 9:00 PM. The Bird-Friendly Habitat Educational Exhibit, or Exhibitat, will have two components—a native plant garden and a Chimney Swift tower. Both components will provide quality bird habitat in Piedmont Park and create new opportunities for interpretive education and wildlife observation while raising awareness about how urban greenspaces benefit biodiversity.

Schedule for September 25, 2018:

- **10:00 AM to 5:00 PM – Chalk Art Festival** with more than 40 chalk artists creating nature-inspired designs in 5' x 5' squares on the sidewalk in front of the Exhibitat at Piedmont Park.
- **5:30 PM to 6:30 PM – A free bird walk** in Piedmont Park with Jason Ward, Atlanta Audubon field trip leader. The group will meet at the bridge over Lake Clara Meer and bird their way to the Exhibitat in time for the unveiling.
- **6:30 to 9:00 PM – Unveiling of the Exhibitat at Piedmont Park** with representatives from Atlanta Audubon, Piedmont Park Conservancy, National Audubon Society, and the City of Atlanta.
